2010-2011

1. November 2010- May 2011- Babysitting for children whose parents attend PTO meetings (Mrs. Wright)
This project will take place throughout the school year on specified dates. Babysitting dates will be available on January 13(3:30), February 15 (6:30), March 17 (3:30), April 12 (6:30), and May 19 (3:30). The location is Gegan Elementary School.
2. December 2010- Bell Ringing for the Salvation Army (Mrs. Wright)
Students will have the opportunity to volunteer their time to ring bells for the Salvation Army. Each shift is 2 hours long. There is a maximum of 3 students per shift. Each shift must be supervised by 1 adult. It is the student's responsibility to secure supervision in advance for their shift. Students may ask parents, teachers, or relatives to supervise.
3. December 2010- March 2011- Helping with Silent Auction (Mrs. Heller)
This project is held in conjunction with a music program to benefit African Charities. Service opportunities include obtaining donations to be included in the silent auction, preparing items for the auction, working the night of the auction, and clean-up the room at the end of the auction. Additional details will be given as they are finalized.
4. February- March 2011- Volunteer at a local nursing home (Mrs. Wright)
Students will plan an activity and will choose a date to attend a nursing home with Mrs. Wright. Activities may include BINGO, crafts, musical performance, visiting, etc.
5. March 2011- Serving a snack at the emergency shelter in Appleton (Mrs. Rankin)
This activity consists of preparing and serving a snack at the Emergency Shelter. All food is provided.
6. Spring 2011- 4 Brown Bags or More- (Mrs. Rankin)
This project requires students to collect 4 brown bags or more of clothing to donate to the Community Clothes Closet. Student should obtain clothing donations from family members and/or friends.
7. Spring 2011- Environmental Clean-up (Mrs. Wright)
Students will spend 2 hours after school picking up litter around the perimeters of Maplewood and UW-Fox Valley.
