

#### Fact Fluency

Do you remember the days of flashcards and timed tests? It's possible that you loved them. It's also possible that they created a lot of anxiety for you. That's why, in school, we use a wider variety of strategies to help students become fluent when solving basic addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts.

We teach students to be strategic and use what they know about numbers to solve problems. This means that to be fluent, they are flexible, efficient, and accurate. Flexible is probably the word that is most different from how many of us learned to solve problems. We just memorized. Fluency is very different from memorization.

For instance, 11-3 might sound like, "Well, I know that 8 + 2 = 10 and then one more would get 11, so the answer is 8. 8 is 3 away from 11."

Or, 6x7 might sound like, "5 groups of 7 is 35, so I just need to add one more group of 7. 35 + 7 = 42, so 6x7 is 42."

Even though that is a lot of words, students who solve this way are usually very quick in solving so it may even look memorized. But ask them, "How did you know?" Their explanation will show a lot of number sense.

So how do we do this in school:

- 1. Explicit teaching of strategies (see your Bridges Newsletters for hints)
- 2. WorkPlace Games
- 3. Visuals such as ten frames, bead racks, arrays

But most importantly, how can you help at home?

- 1. Play games with your children that have them use facts. Honor their strategies.
- 2. Encourage students to explain their thinking about numbers.
- K-2 families can help students know their 5 and 10 facts and partners that equal 4, 6,7, 8 and
   9.
- 3-5 families can help their students know their 2,5,10 and square number facts. Then
  encourage them to use those to figure out the others.

# CAREGIVER CORNER WAYS TO NURTURE WRITING AT HOME

Setting children up to write is helping them make something meaningful. Whether it's a book or a short note, words carry a message that matters. Think of writing time as a makerspace, where the process of making is just as powerful as the product!

All you need to get started is something to write *with* and something to write *on*! Some possibilities include colorful pens, pencils, markers, chalk, cardstock, unlined paper, doodle boards, dry erase boards, paper of any shape, or cut to any size, stapled booklets, and sticky notes. You might also add revision tools such as scissors, tape, glue sticks, and a stapler.

### MAKE TIME AND SPACE FOR WRITING

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Display materials in an easily-accessible space in your home. Then, provide time and space for kids to create. Think aloud, "Hmm.. I wonder what you'll make! I can't wait to find out..."

Step away and allow the magic to unfold. Be a captivated audience when they are ready to share. Ask lots of open-ended questions. Marvel at their process and celebrate their approximations.

\*And if not much happens, don't worry! It can take time to build those "maker muscles." Below, you'll find more directed writing ideas that, in time, kids will incorporate on their own.



#### BE PENPALS

Leave a small note somewhere for your child to discover. Include a blank piece of paper and encourage them to write back!

You might set an older child up to do this digitally as well.

### INFUSE WRITING INTO PLAY

Leave blank paper or sticky notes and pens beside a play kitchen or building blocks.

You might nudge the child by saying things like: "Oh, you were playing 'restaurant?' Would you like to make a menu? What will you put on it?! I hope there will be milkshakes!"

"You can label the parts of your building. I'll show you how!"

"Are you playing a game? Do you want to keep score? You can keep track on this notepad."

### DISCOVER WRITING IN THE WORLD

Notice the variety of writing in the world and the purpose each serves. Suggest that your child might make a sign, a note, or a list of things to remember, especially for an authentic purpose like a trip to the grocery store or a reminder to wash your hands. Emphasize these purposes out loud. "Oh! I keep forgetting ingredients at the store. Will you help me make a list?"

### SPREAD KINDNESS

Point out how writing can spread kindness and show that we care for others. Make greeting cards to celebrate, invite, or connect with friends and relatives. Then, mail or deliver them together!

You might also invite your child to compose an email or text message with you and attach a hand drawn picture.

# USE FAVORITE BOOKS AS

After reading a book your child loves, suggest that they make a book just like it! They might feel inspired to write about a similar character or setting. Or, they might write an information book with a similar structure or topic.

Fold paper or cardstock and staple a spine to create a blank book. Encourage your child to think about the things they loved most about the book and to fill the pages with their own ideas.
