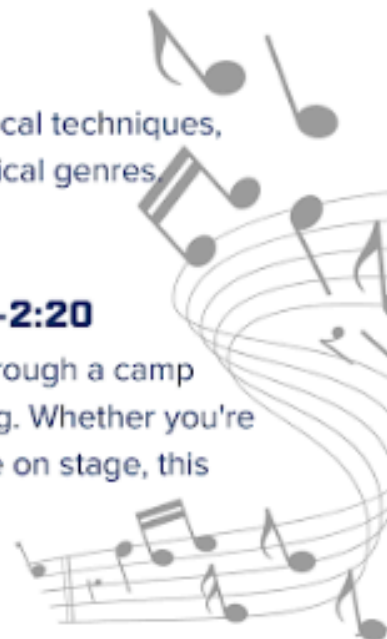
Beginner Orchestra Camp
